IMPORTANT REMINDER regarding Ownership Changes:

All changes in ownership: adding or removing a spouse/child, creating a Life Estate, etc., **MUST BE TRANACTED by a LICENSED TITLE AGENT or ATTORNEY and the required paperwork must be submitted by them to SRI for approval.** Transfer paperwork prepared by any other means is **NOT ACCEPTABLE.**

RULES REMINDERS...

-Vehicles parked at the Clubhouse overnight MUST DISPLAY THE UNIT NUMBER in the FRONT WINDOW.

-Guests Must be signed-in at the Clubhouse Guest Book at the Information Center.

-DRESS CODE: Residents and Guests must wear Shirts (No Bare Tops), Bathing Suit Cover-Ups, and Footwear in the Park when not on the Owner's PREMISES. PLEASE ADVISE GUESTS.

-Park BICYCLES at BIKE RACKS behind pool. Bikes and Scooters may not be brought into the pool area nor parked in front of the Clubhouse.

-Please remember, SHOWERING BEFORE ENTERING THE POOL IS REQUIRED.

-Enjoying Food and Beverages while IN the pool is not permitted. Food and Beverages must NOT be within 4-ft of pool's edge. And please remember, FOR SAFETY, GLASS containers are PROHIBITED in the pool patio area.

TALES FROM THE SOUTH PACIFIC

(continued from last month)



Tasman Sea: Because of a treacherous windstorm blowing through this area, we changed our route and had to eliminate the passage through the Milford Sound -very disappointing but thank goodness we did not tackle the eye of the storm as the outer edges had swells of 15 to 24 feet / 5 to 8 metres. A very rock and roll experience!! Safety comes first!

New Zealand: This fabulous country has five million people and twenty-six million sheep. The coastlines of both North and South Islands are dramatic, being formed by strong ocean waves and the volcanic as well as earthquake actions. The South Island has a backbone formed by the Southern Alps. The North Island has lots of geothermal action. The country's economy is largely supported by agriculture including not only sheep, dairy and beef cattle, and garden products but also a flourishing lumber industry. The movie making industry is flourishing in New Zealand, providing locations for the filming of movies such as Lord of the Rings, and a thriving business of making props for movies such as Avatar.

South Island:

Port Chalmers reminds us of the towns of England, with its shops, small homes built on the surrounding hillsides with lush colourful gardens, and a cathedral. There were innumerable logging trucks with two or three trailers attached, taking the load to the wharf for shipment to Asia.

Timaru is another bustling seaport with British influence. Our excursion took us to a small botanical garden, a drive through long stretches of agricultural land, and a stop in a seaside village, again reminiscent of England.

Akaroa is the only New Zealand town settled by the French but colonized by the British! The buildings and street names reflect the influence of both. The driver of the Hop On Hop Off van shared his extensive knowledge of this town.

North Island:

Wellington, the capital of New Zealand, has a funicular railway up the mountain, affording beautiful views of the harbour and city. We walked for a few hours on winding up and down paths through the Royal Botanical Gardens to get to the bottom. With all its exciting venues, Wellington deserves more than a one day visit.

Napier is absolutely a favourite of the entire ship!! this very small city has been almost completely rebuilt after an earthquake in 1931. The art deco style reflects that era, as do the cars, the period costume, and the band that greeted us at the ship. Our fabulous morning tour included a drive through agricultural land, then a private estate on winding tracks up and down the hillsides of sheep and beef cattle stations and of pine forests of the logging industry, and the cliff top sanctuary for 9000 gannets, birds who's nests were within feet of us along with the chicks crying to be fed by the parent birds! That afternoon we met with relatives of Owen's , a third cousin and some of his family, discovered through family tree research. Exciting!

Auckland, the largest city in New Zealand, is built on a volcano and encircled by fifty more! While Owen and a "birding" friend went by Uber several miles away I browsed the shops and eateries where we were docked, right downtown. With a total of 1 islands of which 75 are inhabited 2,000 steps, 8km. of walking, the two birders did find the birds that nest and feed in the mudflats, then migrate back to the Arctic the end of March. With so much to see and do in Auckland, we explored on day two here with the Hop On Hop Off bus. A vibrant very modern city!

Waitangi is an historical site of great significance as it is the birthplace of the country of New Zealand. Situated on the Bay of Islands, our anchorage has us surrounded by many of the 40 inhabited islands out of the 140 in this bay. The tender from the ship took us to the wharf at the historic site and from there we took a shuttle bus to one town and then a ferry to our destination, Russell. This vacation town has ocean front and streets lined with shops and restaurants housed

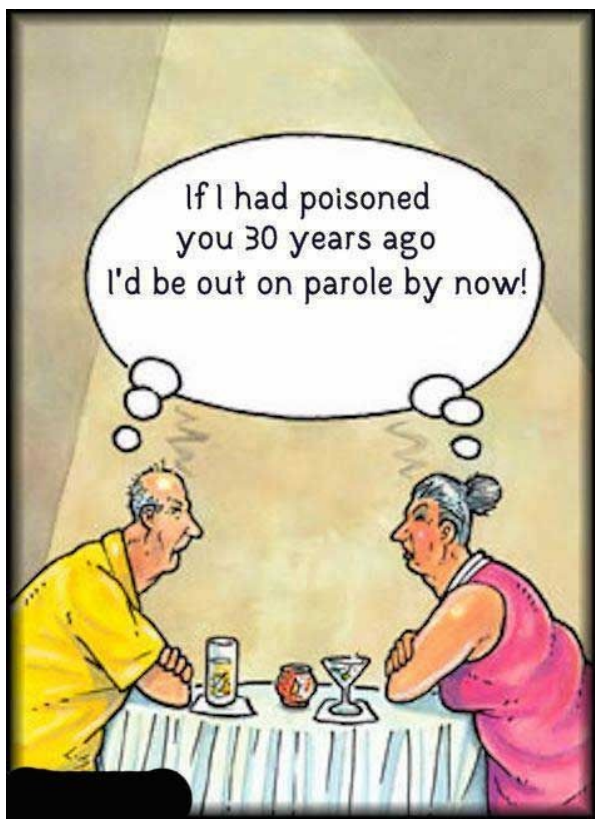
in buildings from a bygone era, very charming with a relaxed feel.

We have now come to the end of our New Zealand adventure and would love to come here again!

Tonga's capital city **Nuka Alofa**, shows evidence of decline since our visit here four years ago, due in part to covid and no tourism for those years. This island has suffered through several cyclones and tsunamis over the years. The royal palace of this only surviving monarchy in the South Pacific dominates the view in the port. We strolled by the government buildings, irreparably damaged church, newer Catholic church with a unique spire and multi sided construction, and many shops and small businesses. The people were very warm and friendly, and appeared to be happy. Tonga has a very matriarchal and Christian society.

French Polynesia is a nation of 121 islands of which 75 are populated. We will be here for the next nine days. Looking forward to sharing with you those last port days in future Beacon.
