

SHUFFLEBOARD STARTS IN NOVEMBER

Shuffleboard season is upon us! We have at least 21 residents who participate in the sport. It is such a great sport for seniors, with a rich and long history in Pinellas County. I would like to explain a little about our team here in Stonehedge. We are in the Pinellas BIG TEN League, along with nine other parks. Three are in Clearwater, one in Oldsmar, two in Countryside, one in Dunedin, one in Palm Harbor and two in Tarpon Springs. The season starts on November 12th and ends on March 20th. That's right folks, that is about five months. We travel to the other nine locations and we host the other nine parks, for a total of 18 games. We have two teams, the "B" team which plays on Mondays and the "A" team that plays on Wednesdays. At the end of the season, the league runs a tournament at the Clearwater Shuffle Club in which players from each team try to win the title of doubles champion of the league. Once you get into shuffleboard, it kind of gets into your skin so to speak. I personally started playing in 2007 and along with my wife, started in the league in 2008. The rules are easy to learn, but mastery of the game, like any game, requires experience, some degree of talent, and the ability to out-think your opponent. I know you may be thinking, "I would put too much pressure on myself" which is what normally happens to a new player. However, as a new player, you are not expected to "light up the board" overnight. If you think of starting to play the game, you should first think of it as a new adventure, meeting a lot of friendly people both in our team and throughout the league, and learn from both watching other games and reviewing your own game at the conclusion. Once on the team, other team members will be happy to talk to you about your game and answer any questions you have about play. After a few weeks vou will become comfortable with how the game is played and you will actually WIN. You see, players are selected to play other players based on their

location on the team roster. Players with lower number of wins play other players who have also lower numbers of wins on the other team, so you are not being "thrown to the wolves" so to speak. If vou are considering learning shuffleboard, our captains and co-captains are there to introduce you to the rules, and there is no requirement to immediately begin play in the league until you feel you are ready. Practices are scheduled on off days throughout the week. Consider this, however. A member of the team is expected to play the entire season (for the most part), travel to away games. be on time for the start of each game, and assist with other duties such as helping to put away equipment after home games. Each member is also assigned to provide a cake when it is their turn during the season (for halftime refreshments). Your turn happens about twice each season. I will try to explain the way a "meet" is run next time. In the meanwhile, to satisfy your curiosity, come out to a home game as a spectator and see if the game is something you would enjoy. First games are November 12th (B team) and November 14th (A team) at noon or thereabouts.

The Landscape Article By the landscape guy November 2018

Welcome to the fall season in Florida. No real difference from past seasons. At this point we should all know how it works and how we should work to take care of our yards.

As you may have noticed the trend in Florida and the subject of these articles, as with any plush flowering garden or healthy lawn, you are always preparing for the next season ahead. What you do today to your lawn and plantings you will see the results in the next quarter. Actually it's what you do today, if done correctly, you will **not see** in the next quarter – and that is bugs and disease.

We are in a great period of the season – not too cool- not too hot. This will give you the time to make the adjustments to your lawn and garden feeding system. I repeat- this will give you the time.

Just like your body, your plants have to adjust and will go thru a short stress period. If they were not healthy, that stress period takes more of a toll on them and you will see damage. So keep an eye on your lawn and shrubs during this change in weather.

This is the time that you need to be positive that your sprinkler system is operating properly on a regular (weekly) basis. The lawns are used to getting the natural rains of the summer and they still need a good healthy dose of water (about 45 minutes a zone-1hour for rotor zones) once a week.

If they are starved of nutrients that they are used to, then your lawn is just like a wounded animal and subject to prey.

NOTE- DO NOT PANIC –This is the start of the semi-dormant season--if you see some browning or lack of growth over the next few weeks – this is natural when we get night temperatures in the 60's and 50's. most yards during this period only need to be cut 2x per month since growth is slow.

The stress levels of your lawn have started to slow down as well as the feeding habits of invading pests. Please do not be confused, this is just the start and the changes to the naked eye will be evident, such as slower growth of grass and shrubs, but that does not mean the critters that invade your lawn have stopped eating. They're out there.

A onetime watering for 45 minutes will force the roots to dig deeper for the water, by watering for a lesser time will keep the roots near the surface and making them more susceptible to burn in the summer or freeze when there is a frost and easy prey for surface critters and fungus. Watering for an adequate time once a week is far more important than watering multiple days.

A blanket coating of a pesticide/fungicide liquid will also help greatly. Some of the better do-it-yourself products are made by Bayer and Spectracide. These products will not harm your lawn if over sprayed, BUT please read the directions, there is no need to put more chemicals into the environment than necessary.

If you feel the urge to fertilize, use a fertilizer with a higher last # (Potassium). This will allow your root system to strengthen for the winter season. Proper watering will also allow the roots to go deeper and avoid any frost we may get.

<u>I cannot stress the importance of mastering the operation of your sprinkler system especially during this recent dry spell</u>

What to get out of this is to make sure your sprinkler systems are in full working order.

Sprinkler systems 101. First ask yourself how likely are power surges in Florida? Now that you know it's pretty much an everyday occurrence here please read the following simple advice about your sprinkler system.

Your sprinkler timer MUST have a good battery in it, change it every 6 months. The battery ONLY holds the time settings during power surges. IT DOES NOT RUN YOUR SYSTEM. The battery, although it's a low voltage system, does not have enough umph to open or close your valves. Also, if the battery is bad, a power surge will reset your timer to the original factory settings which are 10 minutes per zone 7 days a week. If the battery is good, the proper settings will hold.

It is highly recommended to get a cheap (\$8-10) surge protector and add it to the system. During power surges there is a very good likelihood that the small fuse will burn out in the timer. If this happens your system will not work at all. This surge protector is a cheap addition as opposed to a dead lawn replacement. There is also the possibility of burning out the transformer, although less likely, it's a possibility. Simple items, simple fix. Low cost.

This is a must

Clean the grass that has grown up around your sprinkler heads. Overgrown grass inhibits the water flow that covers your entire yard, those areas not covered will turn brown and die and/or be susceptible to pests.

Make sure there is proper coverage. Every sprinkler timer on the planet comes with a MANUAL program. This is so you do not have to run out in your undies at 3AM to see if your system has no broken or grass covered heads. It can be done anytime you want by the simple push of a button or 2. Any system can be checked in about 4-5 minutes, tops.

Now is also the time to freshen up the mulch in the flower beds. Again, a good 4 inches is recommended. This will not only prevent some weeds from germinating but also retain water in the soil. Remember keep the mulch about 2 inches from the trunk of a tree or stem of a bush. The plant tends to rot if the stem stays wet near the base for an extended period of time.

I will be reminding you throughout the fall and winter months to keep an eye on your scrubs and flowering plants. If they are not filled out as you are used to or there are areas of dead branches and bear at the base, this may be signs that they have lived their life or they are in the incorrect spot in your yard. We will investigate the issues in future articles
