Job demands, kid demands, and just plain outside demands on your wallet and life were all reasons to create a simplified lifestyle with less of all of it. Now that you have worked and attained your escape, I only ask that you respect it and do some of the simple things that keep up its value and appearance. Thank you!

The Landscape Article

Tis the in between season – we can go either way – not that there is anything wrong with that. The rainy season has left most yards in great shape for the fall season. Yards have come thru so far with very little fungus issues and no chinch bug issues that we are constantly monitoring along with TruGreen -our pest control company as well as Evans Lawn service. We have had some mole cricket issues that we are still working on.

The few yards that have been affected with fungus or mole crickets have been treated and the visual effects will remain for some time until the healthy grass fills in. This will take some effort on your part to inspect to see if the treatments have worked. Best way to see if the treatments have worked is to mark the affected area with a flag and see if it spreads about 3 days later. Also keep an eye on the affected area(s) because weeds normally sprout up before the healthy grass fills in. This may take some time as we know in Florida weeds grow faster than grass, or at least faster than the weeds they call grass here. This is where you come in to aid the already in place park preventative program. The best way to combat weeds is to clean up that portion of the dead –by raking out the dead portion and putting down a pest control product to aid the already in place controls. This will assure that any remaining pests will be under control when the healthy grass starts to fill in, although we do ask TruGreen to follow up to make sure the activity has been controlled.

Any general lawn pest control product will do, Bayer brand is one of the better ones. If you care to sod after the area has been cleaned up, that is the best time to do this or you can wait for the stronger grass to fill in, either way it's your choice.

November is the start of the season to enjoy seasonal annuals and the cool weather blooming plants.

NOTE: I cannot stress this enough. When looking for seasonal plantings (Annuals) or even year-round plantings (Perennials), its best to check out the neighborhood and see what has survived and what looks good. Use the experience that is around you Use the internet, it's the next best source other than your neighborhood. Tarpon Springs is in ZONE 9

I have direct experience with their garden shops and the knowledge is limited at best. PLEASE DO NOT TAKE THE PLANT LABELS SERIOUS ON THESE GARDEN CENTER PLANTS. If you insist on shopping at these garden centers, I suggest you ask a test question or 2 to see if you get the correct answer, such as “are weed and feeds good to use year round?” The answer is “NO” unless you have a completely spotless lawn that needs no other attention, and I doubt that in Florida. There is a reason these stores are called “do it yourself”

November is also the time you should look at the plants that did not make it thru the hot summer months or those that took extra special care. Unless you have the extra time to fuss with them its best to consider options. This may mean that they are not suited to take the heat and should be changed out. If you care to, replace them with more suitable plants that can take the torrid summer months. It's also the time to make sure you are prepared for the next years growing season. This can be done by strengthening the lawn you have. A good all-purpose fertilizer for this time is one with a high last number:

To recap – using a good base fertilizer – like an 18-5-10

18- The first number is the nitrogen parts per million for greening

5- is for phosphorous, which is a natural element in the Florida soil, so you do not need to add any at this stage

10- is for potassium (potash) which helps strengthen the root system.

You have the next 2 months to be able to add this to you soil to strengthen it even more than the natural rains did.

See you next month--It's a good day on the green side of the grass
