# Manager's Korner March 2023 Tony Toscano, Interim Manager

Hi to all once again. It has been wonderful to see that many of our residents remain healthy and happy. It truly has been great to be back even for what is a short period of time. I have committed to March 31 this year.

Lots of stuff to discuss this month. As many of you know I had been gone (and happily retired) since May of 2022. Due to unforeseen circumstances I chose to return to see that Stonehedge continued to be a "Great place to live" and that the following manager is well qualified to continue that feeling.

After reviewing 17 applicants, the Board has chosen to offer the job to Maryanne Aiello. She is an experienced on-site manager of 12-years. She managed an association of 368 homes that included many of the same amenities as Stonehedge and much more. We are grateful that Maryanne has accepted the position here as manager. I will remain on until the end of March or thereabouts. She will officially be starting on Monday Feb 27th. Please make her feel as welcome as you did me but remember, she has a job to do so say "hi" then politely leave hahaha. Which reminds me of another forever moment made whenever. Don't ask me how it relates but - here goes. Now I don't guite remember the entire story, but I do have details up to a certain point and you will see why - believe me it's not age.

The very first apartment I had when I moved out at 17 yrs old was a 2 room 4<sup>th</sup> story top floor walkup, just 1 block off the water in Bay Ridge Brooklyn by Fort Hamilton Army Base. It was a rent-controlled apartment, rent was \$140 month!!, and after 25 years of renting it my rent went up to \$240 monthly. There was a park just outside the front doors of the apartment which led to a beautiful view of the Verrazano Narrows and the River walk. It was also as close to directly under the Verrazano Narrows bridge so when

the NYC Marathon runners were coming across, I had to hold onto my hat and straighten out all the pictures. But well worth the cost.

As I mentioned I rented for 25 years with the hope of it going Condo, but that never came about. After 14 or so years living there, I moved into Manhattan and decided to rent that apartment out. A friend of mine introduced me to a nice girl who wanted to rent it. She said that she traveled a lot and if I would give her a good deal that I could use it anytime she was out of town. So, I only charged her what I was paying – I think \$200 or so at that time. Well, it worked out fantastic. I would call her or her me when she left town and I got to use the place often. Since I played softball in the neighborhood and still hung out with the old Brooklyn boyz and with my family, it was a great deal.

Well, this one particular weekend when she was out of town, I go to stay over, after plopping down on the couch, I notice a bunch of scattered pictures (20 or so) on the cocktail table. So naturally I flip thru them. Many of the pictures were of her (by the way very attractive) and her girlfriend (also very attractive) acting foolishly, piggybacking, making faces, just hamming it up, etc. As I flipped thru them, I noticed that a few of the pictures were either her or her girlfriend or both lying down across the lap of a guy sitting on a couch. After the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> picture of these I stopped, a bit confused, took a 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> look, squinted my eyes, shook my head, and took another closer look at the guy they were playfully lying across. The guy was Keith Richards, yes!! THE KEITH RICHARDS !! from the Rolling Stones. Keith Richards, in my apartment! on my couch!

After the 10<sup>th</sup> or so look to completely make sure I was looking at what I was looking at, I had to call her and find out what ??? . For obvious reasons she does not tell everyone but gave me a good rundown of her relationship with Richards. I never pushed her to introduce me, knowing it was her deal. Well, it turns out she went to High School in Staten Island with Keith Richards' wife, Patti Hanson, with whom

she remained good friends. The reason she travels so much is that she is the nanny for Keith and Patti's children, who were infants, when they go on tour.

She told me a few stories about that day and how it all came about that they ended up in my apartment, mostly because it was out of the way and quiet and obviously no one expected to see Keith Richards there. Well, she told me that they had a great time hanging out there and that Keith couldn't believe I was only charging her \$200 or so for the place. She said she and he were so grateful, since it was a perfect location and close to Patti's parents who were still in Staten Island. To show his appreciation she said Keith left me a gift in the fridge. Well, I checked the fridge while she was still on the phone and all she said was "Have a good time" I thanked her and told her to thank Keith.

I have to comment on the current issues that I see around the park during recent inspections. As always, its not everyone but everyone can help. This is not a reprimand by any means but rather a reminder.

- Dumpster use recently it has been over filled and the company has commented that they will not pick it up if filled above the top.
  - Doors and other items MUST be cut up (to 4' of less) before stuffing in

- the dumpsters and not left for staff to do it.
- If you bring it to the dumpster -if it's not filled - put it in the dumpster- if it's questionable - call the office
- Parking on the sidewalks and grass C'mon – this is common sense – remind your guests and vendors to stay off our sidewalks – not only does it dirty them but its uncomfortable for those walking to go around them.
- Parking around the clubhouse -Overflow parking is for 5 days max - in a month - not 5 days - then one off and 5 more on- again common sense.
  - Each vehicle parked around the clubhouse should have an identifying unit # on the dash if parked for more than 1 day.
- Use of the company truck available from 7:30 AM – and it MUST be back by 2PM – limited to 2 hours per use.
- Coverups to and from the pool- I know we all love being naked or semi-nakedbut others may not want to see you – please when coming to and leaving the pool area- please wear coverups.
  - Do not come to and leave the pool in your bathing suit – and for the bronze Adonis men, shirts are required coming to and leaving the pool area as well.
- If you have any questions about any rules it starts and stops in the office it starts with a request and stops with approval or a suggested change.
  What you do not like there are petitions available for you to suggest and make a change to anything you want to see changed or reviewed use your resources not your chatter

Also as a reminder, when asking for a request from staff – remember - it's a request – do not ask as if it was a demand.

Recently the "hey you!" and the "do this " is not a proper way to address anyone on staff.

Art is the maintenance man, and Ted is the Clubhouse staff that work for all and do an excellent job.

Also it would be appreciated to let visitors and relatives who are not owners to come to the office rather than giving directions directly to our staff members. That is the job of the manager. Thank you.
