


Let's clear some waste disposal confusion.

**Recycling and Yard Waste**  
**are picked up curbside**  
**each Thursday**

- **Recycling** is to be placed in provided green bins. Large pieces must be cut down to fit in those bins or similar sized cardboard boxes. Items placed for recycling must be clean. (No greasy pizza boxes) If you do not want to wait for Thursday, or have a large quantity to recycle, visit the **Local Recycling Drop Off Center at 898 S Levis Ave**, Mon-Fri, 7am to 4:30pm and Sat 7am to 12pm. You can **call 727-943-0067** with questions regarding **Recycling and Yard Waste**.

- **Yard Waste** is to be placed curbside in yard waste bags, available at local hardware stores, or bundled and tied. Bundles are to be no more than 75lbs and not exceed 4 foot in length. Large amounts of yard waste can also be dropped off at **898 S Levis Ave**, Mon-Fri, 7am to 4:30pm and Sat 7am to 12pm.

- **Household Garbage** bags are to be placed at the curb **Monday morning** by 7am. There is a **5-bag limit**, per pick up day, and each bag must **not be heavier than 75lbs**. Questions regarding large/bulk items can be directed to Waste Management at **727-572-8779**.

- **Household Hazardous Waste** should not be set out by the curb or mixed in regular household waste. Items such as paint products, batteries, unused chemicals, etc., can be dropped off at 29582 US Hwy 19 N, on select Saturdays. Call 727-464-7500 for upcoming schedules.

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**The Southwest Florida Water Management District (District) Governing Board declared a Modified Phase II “Severe” Water Shortage** due to dry conditions throughout the region, which requires all residents, including those on private wells, in the cities and counties listed below to follow one-day-per-week watering restrictions.

**The restrictions apply to** all of Citrus, DeSoto, Hardee, Hernando, Hillsborough, Manatee, Pasco, **Pinellas**, Polk, Sarasota and Sumter counties; portions of Charlotte, Highlands and Lake counties; the City of Dunnellon and The Villages in Marion County; and the portion of Gasparilla Island in Charlotte County **from Feb. 8, 2026, through July 1, 2026.**

The District received below average rainfall during its summer rainy season and currently has a **13-inch regional rainfall deficit** compared to the average 12-month total. In addition, water levels in the District's water resources, such as aquifers, rivers and lakes, are continuing to decline and many are below normal. Public water supplies in the Tampa Bay area are lower than expected at this time of year. **Outdoor water use accounts for more than 50% of water consumed by households.**

Other activities listed in the Water Shortage Order include:

- Low-volume watering of plants and shrubs (micro-irrigation, soaker hoses, hand watering) is allowed any day and any time.
- Annual pressure washing or in preparation for painting and sealing is allowed.
- No HOA or other entity shall enforce deed restrictions or other community standards requiring an increase in water use, including replacement of plant material to meet aesthetic standards or pressure washing.
- Car washing at home (non-commercial) is only allowed on your lawn watering day and you must use a hose with a shutoff nozzle.
- Aesthetic fountains are limited to eight hours a day

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### Rules & Regs Reminder

All residents and guests are to use individual driveways or park in the general parking areas at the Clubhouse subject to restrictions. Legal parallel parking on Community streets is permitted as long as you do not block any resident's driveway, sidewalk, roadway, access gate, entry way, right or left line of sight, or any intersection. At the Clubhouse, park so that bumper does not extend over sidewalk.

## February 2026, Beacon Managers Corner, Retraction Regarding Yard Waste

First, let me apologize for adding more confusion to the yard waste collection issue.

After having verified through their website and fliers and then speaking with Waste Management before publishing, I was instructed multiple times that yard waste was to be placed at the curb with the Thursday recycling.

After receiving feedback from several owners, and one who spoke with a gentleman who was on the collection truck, I called the head of the sanitation department. After researching the issue, he informed me that Stonehedge is a Special exception.

Stonehedge is one of only two communities in the Tarpon Springs area that do not have garbage collection service twice a week. If we had twice weekly, then everything we have been told, and I have pushed at owners for the last several months, would be accurate.

However, with our garbage collection service being once a week and no budget to increase costs for a second pick up, **THERE IS NOT SPECIFIC YARD WASTE COLLECTION FOR THE STONEHEDGE COMMUNITY. ALL YARD WASTE IS TO BE PLACED IN PLASTIC BAGS, CURBSIDE FOR MONDAY GARBAGE PICK UP.**

Again, my apologies for the confusion.

2 Tbsp Fresh Lime Juice






## SPRING SALE
