## Long Range Planning:

Tudor reported on plans and fund raising for improvements to the Pavillon to be presented to the residents to vote on. The monies for the Pavillon will not be paid for by our maintenance fees.

Architectural Committee: Chairperson Streff reported that there are many new requests by residents for improvement to their units and that no work can be done until the resident receives approval from the committee. Presently there is an issue with one unit where work was done without approval. The manager and the committee will work with the residents to resolve the issue.

<u>Budget Committee:</u> Elton and Toscano reported on the delinquency in maintenance fees and special assessments fees. The delinquency fees including the sale of two units are down from \$30,000.00 to approximately \$6,000.00.
